



WHAT IS TX-PACE?

TEXAS PROPERTY ASSESSED CLEAN ENERGY


A simple way of paying for capital projects with no money out of pocket.

- What: 100% long term, low cost financing Energy efficiency, water conservation, and distributed generation/resiliency projects
- Where: On commercial (non-profit, hospitality, healthcare industrial (manufacturing, agricultural); and multi-family (5+units) properties

ELIGIBLE IMPROVEMENTS

Projects that reduce energy or water usage or generate energy onsite.

Many of these measures can also make the property more resilient



WHY TX-PACE?

LOWER UTILITY COSTS AND INCREASE NET OPERATING INCOME





HOW TX-PACE WORKS

A Building Owner:

finds a contractor

selects a project identifies a capital provider

applies to PACE program

If the owner, building, and project all meet PACE requirements:

the owner
signs a
contract with
the PACE
program,
which places
a senior lien
on the
property

lender signs
a contract
with the
county in
exchange
for the
assessment
payments

the capital provider provides funding

contractors complete the project the PACE
program bills
assessments
to the
owner and
forwards
the payments
to the
lender



HELPS OVERCOME INVESTMENT BARRIERS

INVESTMENT BARRIER	TX-PACE SOLUTION
Upfront capital	No upfront capital needed
Insufficient payback / short ROI	Funded up to life of equipment (20 years+)
Lack of funding	100% financing – not a personal or business loan
Landlord / tenant split incentives	Can be passed to tenants
Short-term ownership	Stays with the land – transfers upon sale



FINANCIAL IMPACT OF TX-PACE


 Increase property value with no capital investment by building owner

Generate positive cash flows immediately

Example: \$1.1M Efficiency U Savings \$125K/yr	Jpgrade	\$400,000	
Project Cost	\$1,100,000	(\$200,000) (\$400,000)	
Term	20 Yrs @6%	(\$600,000)

CAPITAL STACK APPROACH: DEVELOPER

Example: \$24M Redevelopment



TX-PACE Assessments CAN Include:

- The cost of materials and labor necessary for the installation of a qualified improvement.
- Permit fees;
- Inspection fees;
- Lender's fees;
- Program application and administrative fees;
- Project development and engineering fees;

- Independent Third Party Review fees, including verification fees;
- Any other fees or costs that may be incurred by the property owner incidental to the installation, modification, or improvement:
- Legal, consulting and other fees on an actual cost basis; and
- Changes to the existing property that are incidental to the installation.
